THE MYSTERIOUS EGYPTIAN CAT GODDESS

In the vast tapestry of Egyptian mythology, few figures are as enigmatic and captivating as Bastet, the Cat Goddess. Known for her many roles, Bastet has intrigued historians, worshippers, and lovers of mythology for centuries. Her image is diverse—sometimes appearing as a beautiful woman with the head of a cat, sometimes as a European woman with long blonde hair and bright blue eyes, and occasionally as a full cat. This feline form, however, is just one of her many layers.





The Gentle Protector and Fierce Defender

Bastet's essence is a study in contrasts. As the Protector of Women and the Home, she was known for her gentleness, offering protection and care to those in need. But this goddess also had a fearsome side. When called upon to defend against those who brought harm and chaos to society, her ferocity knew no bounds. She was not only a goddess of love and nurturing but also a powerful enforcer of justice.

THE WORSHIP OF BASTET

Bastet was beloved by the people of Lower Egypt, where she was worshipped as the Lion-Headed Goddess of War. She defended both the Pharaoh and her father, the sun god Ra. According to legend, Bastet rode through the sky with Ra, pulling the sun across the heavens and fiercely defending him from his enemies. Because of this, she was known as the Lady of the East, the Goddess of the Rising Sun, and the All-Seeing Eye. Her role was akin to that of Seth, as she protected Ra from Apophis, the serpent of darkness and chaos.

Each year, thousands of worshippers gathered in Bubastis, Bastet's hometown, to celebrate her festival, a time of devotion and revelry. Her temple housed over 300,000 mummified cats, a testament to her connection with these sacred animals.



BASTET'S EVOLUTION: FROM LIONESS TO CAT



As time passed, Bastet's image evolved. While she started as a lion-headed goddess, her form gradually softened to that of a domestic cat. In ancient Egypt, cats were revered for their ability to protect homes from disease-carrying vermin. This reverence translated into worship, and Bastet became a symbol of protection and health.

Although her ferocious nature diminished, Bastet remained an important figure, especially in Northern Egypt, even as dynasties fell and her prominence waned. In the Greek world, she transitioned to a minor moon goddess, but her influence lingered.

A perfect bond with my furry friends

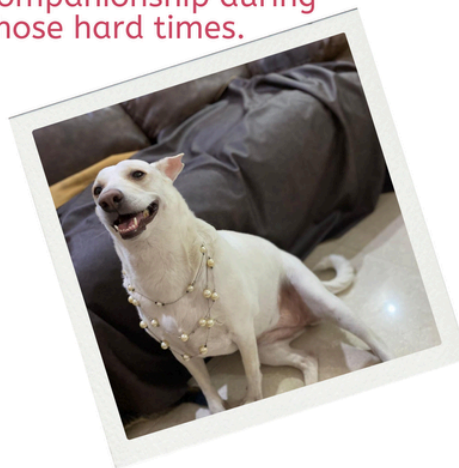
Let's start with Woofy.

He's a handsome 10-year-old Dachshund and has been with me since I was in 8th grade. History and Origins

Historically favored by Mughal emperors like Akbar, the Bully Kutta was used for hunting large game and guarding palaces.

USE IN DOG FIGHTING

Regrettably, Bully Kuttas have also gained a reputation for being used in illegal dog fighting across India and Pakistan. Authorities in Punjab, India, have recently taken steps to curb these practices, with FIRs being filed against those involved in organizing such fights. Non-profit organizations are also working to raise awareness and end the exploitation of these dogs.

Popularity and Recognition

The Bully Kutta is particularly popular in the Punjab region of India and Pakistan. In India, breeders have focused on the scientific breeding of this dog under the guidelines of the Indian Mastiff Registry. The breed is recognized by the Indian National Kennel Club and continues to be a symbol of strength and resilience.

Signs to Watch For and How to Help Your Pet

We love our dogs and hate to see them suffer. If your dog has been slowing down or acting differently, it could be due to joint pain, especially as they age. Dogs can't tell us when they're hurting, so we need to look for certain signs to ensure they get the care they need. Dr. Zoop, an animal expert, outlines eight signs that may indicate your dog is dealing with joint pain and provides three solutions to help them feel more comfortable.

Common Signs of Joint Pain in Dogs

1

If your dog limps when they get up or walk, particularly if there hasn't been any trauma, this could be a sign of joint pain. Arthritis, especially in the hips, is a common cause of limping in older dogs, leading to inflamed joints and discomfort.

Limping

Slippery surfaces like tile, hardwood, or laminate can cause dogs with joint pain to struggle. Their gait may be off due to pain, making it harder for them to maintain balance.

Slipping on Floors

Loss of Muscle

Joint pain can lead to muscle loss, particularly in the hindquarters. When dogs are in pain, they tend to avoid using their muscles, leading to muscle deterioration and decreased blood flow.

Weight Gain or Loss

If your dog is less active due to joint pain but you're still feeding them the same amount, they may gain weight. Alternatively, joint pain can stress them out, leading to a loss of appetite and weight.

Hesitance to jump on furniture, climb stairs, or even go for walks when they previously enjoyed these activities may indicate joint pain. Dogs quickly learn what movements cause discomfort and start avoiding them.

Irritability

Joint pain can make your dog more irritable, resulting in snapping or growling when touched. This change in behavior often signals that they are in pain.

Licking or Chewing

Dogs may lick, chew, or bite at the painful area in an attempt to soothe their discomfort. Over time, this behavior can lead to irritated skin, hair loss, or even open sores.

8

Lethargy

A dog experiencing joint pain may become less active, as moving around increases their discomfort. Over time, they may prefer to rest more than usual to avoid the pain of movement.



While joint pain is distressing, there are several ways you can help your dog feel better without resorting to surgery:

How to Help Your Dog Feel Better

1

Maintain a Healthy Weight

Keeping your dog at a healthy weight will reduce the stress on their joints, which can help alleviate some of their pain.

Provide Joint Supplements

Talk to your vet about joint supplements like glucosamine and chondroitin, which can help maintain joint health and reduce inflammation.

Make Their Environment Comfortable

Ensure your dog has soft bedding and non-slip rugs or mats to help them move around without straining their joints on slippery surfaces.

Being proactive about your dog's joint health can help them lead a happier, more comfortable life. Pay close attention to their behavior, and if you notice any of these signs, consult your vet for proper diagnosis and treatment. Helping your dog feel better starts with recognizing the problem.

Sweet potato chews are a simple yet delicious homemade treat packed with nutrients and gentle on your doggo's digestive system. Rich in fiber and antioxidants, these chews are a healthy alternative to store-bought treats.

Sweet Potato Chews



INGREDIENTS

- 1 LARGE SWEET POTATO, PEELED AND CUBED
- 1/4 CUP PLAIN YOGURT

Instructions:

PREHEAT OVEN:

To 350°F (175°C).

PREPARE SWEET POTATO:

Place the cubed sweet potato on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake for 30-40 minutes, or until tender.

MASH SWEET POTATO:

Once the sweet potato is cooled, mash it into a smooth paste.

ADD YOGURT:

Stir in the plain yogurt until well combined.

FORM CHEWS:

Use your hands or a cookie cutter to shape the mixture into small chews.

BAKE AGAIN:

Place the chews back in the oven for 10-15 minutes, or until firm.

COOL:

Let the chews cool completely before giving them to your dog



Nutritional Benefits:

- Rich in fiber: Sweet potatoes are a great source of dietary fiber, which can help promote digestive health and prevent constipation.
- Packed with nutrients: Sweet potatoes are also rich in vitamins A, C, and B6, as well as minerals like potassium and iron.
- Gentle on the stomach: Sweet potatoes are generally well-tolerated by dogs with sensitive stomachs.

Tips

- Adjust sweetness: If your dog prefers a sweeter treat, you can add a small amount of honey or maple syrup to the mixture.
- Store properly: Store leftover chews in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to a week.
- Consult your vet: Before introducing any new treats to your dog's diet, consult with your veterinarian to ensure they are suitable for your pet's specific needs.

By following these guidelines, you can provide your dog with a delicious and nutritious treat that they will love.
